I recently learned that the NH Public Utilities Commission is about to release an Order concerning PUC Docket DE 22-060 on Changes to the Current Net Metering Tariff Structure. I understand a Settlement Agreement has been filed by the three investor-owned electric utilities, Clean Energy NH, Conservation Law Foundation (CLF), the Office of the Consumer Advocate (OCA), and the NH Hydro Association.

I urge the PUC to accept this Settlement Agreement. I have solar panels myself and am trying to move towards an all-electric household, which should reduce, even on a small scale, my dependence on fossil fuels. This effort, along with weatherization, use of energy outside of peak energy usage windows, and purchasing electric appliances, vehicles, and tools, should reduce my fossil fuel consumption. Without net metering, none of my personal goals that are clearly helping to clean up our environment will be possible.
