I recently learned that the NH Public Utilities Commission is about to release an Order concerning PUC Docket DE 22-060 on Changes to the Current Net Metering Tariff Structure. I understand a Settlement Agreement has been filed by the three investor-owned electric utilities, Clean Energy NH, Conservation Law Foundation (CLF), the Office of the Consumer Advocate (OCA), and the NH Hydro Association.

I **urge the PUC to accept this Settlement Agreement.** As a town energy commissioner and a home-owner with solar, net metering has enabled a broad range of benefits to the community, including stabilization and reduction of electricity costs to taxpayers (through municipal solar projects), homeowners, and businesses. These projects also tend to encourage broader discussion and implementation of economically and environmentally sensible practices at the individual and town level.

I am copying the PUC Clerk on this email so that my concern and support for the Settlement Agreement will be entered into the docket.
