I recently learned that the NH Public Utilities Commission is about to release an Order concerning PUC Docket DE 22-060 on Changes to the Current Net Metering Tariff Structure. I understand a Settlement Agreement has been filed by the three investor-owned electric utilities, Clean Energy NH, Conservation Law Foundation (CLF), the Office of the Consumer Advocate (OCA), and the NH Hydro Association.

I urge the PUC to accept this Settlement Agreement. *I've had several contractors visit my house and was planning to invest in solar energy to stabilize and offset my electricity costs. I can't do that without net metering. It's not only important to me, but I want all citizens to have this opportunity. Most importantly, it helps our state reduce greenhouse gas emissions and slow down global warming. To eliminate net metering would mean NH doesn't care about our global impact on our fellow human beings and the biodiverse world we inhabit. Please, not on my behalf!!*
