I recently learned that the NH Public Utilities Commission is about to release an Order concerning PUC Docket DE 22-060 on Changes to the Current Net Metering Tariff Structure. I understand a Settlement Agreement has been filed by the three investor-owned electric utilities, Clean Energy NH, Conservation Law Foundation (CLF), the Office of the Consumer Advocate (OCA), and the NH Hydro Association.

## I urge the PUC to accept this Settlement Agreement.

We are planning to install a \$40,000 solar system this spring which will provide nearly 100% of the electricity that our household uses each year.

Net metering makes it more difficult to afford this project.

Come on Governor. Texas produces over 50% of its electricity from renewable sources. We could and should do the same or more here in New Hampshire.

I am copying the PUC Clerk on this email so that my concern and support for the Settlement Agreement will be entered into the docket.
