I recently learned that the NH Public Utilities Commission is about to release an Order concerning PUC Docket DE 22-060 on Changes to the Current Net Metering Tariff Structure. I understand a Settlement Agreement has been filed by the three investor-owned electric utilities, Clean Energy NH, Conservation Law Foundation (CLF), the Office of the Consumer Advocate (OCA), and the NH Hydro Association.

I urge the PUC to accept this Settlement Agreement. I am the vice chair of the Tamworth Energy Committee that has been working with the town to develop more sustainable and less costly energy options for the town --including our joining the Community Power Coalition of New Hampshire. Nothing is more urgent given the profound climate crisis we are facing. I'm also an owner of a solar array.

To my mind, the fact that New Hampshire has the lowest Net Metering rate in New England is unacceptable. The rate should be higher, not lower.

I am copying the PUC Clerk on this email so that my concern and support for the Settlement Agreement will be entered into the docket.
