Governor Sununu,

I understand that the NH Public Utilities Commission is about to release an Order concerning PUC Docket DE 22-060 on Changes to the Current Net Metering Tariff Structure. Further, I understand a Settlement Agreement has been filed by the three investor-owned electric utilities, Clean Energy NH, Conservation Law Foundation (CLF), the Office of the Consumer Advocate (OCA), and the NH Hydro Association.

I urge the PUC to accept this Settlement Agreement.

As a small business owner (EMF Inc. in Keene), I invested in a solar power system in late 2019. I absolutely count on Net Metering to make the investment economically viable. It is unreasonable to change the rules mid-stream. Worse, as a community, we must press forward shifting to non-carbon renewable energy. The idea that we'd remove incentives and effectively block many small businesses from doing as I have done is short sighted, bad for the environment, and bad for the economy.

I am copying the PUC Clerk on this email so that my concern and support for the Settlement Agreement will be entered into the docket.
