6. (a) Summary of what the rule says and of any proposed amendments including whether the rule implements a state statute for the first time:

The Public Utilities Commission (Commission) is proposing to readopt with amendment the existing Chapter Puc 300 to reflect the division of electric service regulatory responsibilities between the Commission and the Department of Energy (Department), which was created under RSA 12-P:2, I, after consultation between the two agencies. The Department is concurrently adopting its own rules related to Electric Service. Taken together, the Commission's proposed rules and the Department's proposed En 300 rules maintain the existing extent and scope of state regulation of electric service as is currently reflected in Chapter Puc 300.

The Commission is proposing to readopt with amendment, in substantially the same form as the existing rules, rules that specify standard procedures, general business rules for electric service in order to enable them to comply with relevant laws.

Proposed amendments include the removal of existing parts of rules governing master metering, meter reading, quality of electric service, equipment and facilities, other reporting, and enforcement procedures which the Department intends to adopt as part of Chapter En 300 in a rulemaking proceeding that will occur contemporaneously with this proposed action. Proposed amendments also include edits, updates, clarifying changes, and cross references to the Department's proposed rule set.

The existing rules are scheduled to expire May 21, 2024 but are subject to extension pursuant to RSA 541-A:14-a.

6. (b) Brief description of the groups affected:

Puc 300 rules generally apply to any public utility providing electric service to the public in the state of New Hampshire and their customers. Puc 301.01(b) indicates the provisions of the rules that apply to the New Hampshire Electric Cooperative.
